***Perry County in Pen and Ink** [1983] – Hardback \$25-
1st and ONLY edition. Drawings by Perry County artists.

***The Boss's Boy** [2006] – Hardback – Signed & Numbered \$55-
Released 01.01.07 this tale is that of young Matt Miller, 'The Boss's Boy'. Set in PA, early 1800's, Matt is regularly challenged by the other workers' sons. Inevitably, he will be their 'Boss' one day and is encouraged by his father to prove himself now. This is his story.

Alcatraz, The Hard Years [1989] – Paperback – Not signed/Trade Edition \$25-
Rocky's remembrance of growing up on the Rock; circa 1934-1938. Dad was a Federal Prison Guard and was still alive at time of writing to help with the details. Find out what it was really like!

****The Last Black Book** – [1995] – Hardback \$65-
The Perry County Series has 30 black covered books. This one is a remembrance of each one plus other things that have come to Rocky's mind over the past 30 years of writing. Plenty of photos and humor. An overlooked digest that is available today. *Very few copies remaining*

***Ramsey** [1994] – Hardback \$65-
A retired LA Cop returns home (to Perry County, of course) but the fates bring the villains to New Bloomfield. Filled with intrigue, good reconnaissance and a chance to avenge a partner's death bring an end to the bad guys. Written in true Chandler style.

***Gray's Talent** [1995] – Hardback \$65-
A kick ass book about a retired CIA agent who returns home to Perry County, only to be located by his old enemies. This is a rough book; full of explosions, shooting and neat ideas. And, of course, our hero wins in the end.

***Firefighters of Perry County** [1985] – Hardback \$75-
A pictorial and historical narrative that demonstrates the vigor and energy that Perry Countians put into their community. Complete with >500 photos. *Very few copies remaining.*

***Ted's Story** [1988] – Hard Back \$65-
Perry County Series. Young Perry Countian goes west and builds a magnificent ranch in the valley of the Bones. Well researched and definitely an Old West story. Typical of Chandler; bad guys and lots of Indians. You won't want the story to end.

***Hawks Feather** [1988] – Hardback \$65-
A sailing ship story about Jack Elan's son, Jonas. Lots of pirates, treasure and seagoing yarns.
Very few copies remaining

***Dark Shadow** [1996] – Hardback \$65-
A western story circa 1885. Our hero Josh Logan is trying to retire but looters come to his town and kill his wife. It goes down hill from there – for them. He tracks them 1000 miles, killing as he can, one or two at a time, nibbling away at the renegade band. Ends in Mexico in a way you'll have to read. Full of characters, Indian lore, weapons and is geographically correct. This one is movie quality; Tom Selleck would fit the role marvelously.

***Morgan's Park** [1997] – Hardback \$65-
Last of the Mormon book series. 300+ pages of clean adventure. Set in the old west with Indians and a few good men. Not the usual Chandler style; rather, perhaps as it really was. *Publisher's Note* The first two Mormon books of this series entitled **The Gun of Joseph Smith** and **Tuck Morgan, Plainsman** were sold out and disappeared; legend has it they are circulating in marked Mormon communities as of now....

***Sniper One** [2000] Book #2 in the Iron Brigade Series – Hardback \$45-
In the Iraqi deserts of the 1990's, an American military Scout-Sniper was always in deadly danger. Staff Sergeant "Clicker" Bell's team was dug in and on duty when unexpected orders to assist in a rescue blew everything apart. *Sniper One* ranges from the Iraqi deserts to the western mountains of the U.S. as the acts of war spill over into at least as deadly peacetime combats. This is a tale of action and adventure and a reader will empathize with the fighters and comrades involved. If you enjoy weaponry, large-as-life heroism, gritty combat and real men-with-men action, *Sniper One* will draw you in and make you one with the world of military-trained, long distance warriors. *Few Remaining*

***Shooter Galloway** [2003] Book #3 in the Iron Brigade Series– Hardback \$45-
An action adventure story that journeys from rural PA to the wilds of Montana and finally to the ever-warring Middle East. Gabriel "Shooter" Galloway seeks justice against the villains; a wild, dangerous and brutal family of loggers. Even vigilante justice seems improbable as Pennsylvania's last Galloway seeks justice and vows to kill them all. Shooter Galloway means what he has vowed; this is his story.

Arrowmaker [2000] – #1 in the Frontier Series - Hardback \$45-
A reprint of the 1974 edition; updated and printed in the new format with large print. Signed by Rocky. A novel of the colonial frontier, *Arrowmaker*, adventures with a first settler within the Allegheny mountains; features Rob Shatto, frontiersman and action hero. Rich in lore and accurate historical background, *Arrowmaker* sets the base for the 14 book Frontier series. *Few remaining.*

The Black Rifle [1976/2002] - #2 in the Frontier Series – Hardback \$45-
Our man, Jack Elan, is captured by the Shawnee and taken to Ohio. He manages to escape and the rest of the story is about how he trains himself and slaughters those who return on the warrior path to Perry County. Revised reprint; signed by Rocky.

Tim Murphy Rifleman [1993/2003] – #3 in the Frontier Series – Hardback \$45-
Based on the story of a historic sharpshooter from Perry County who was credited with shooting a British General Officer during The Revolutionary War, Battle of Saratoga at a range so great it was believed impossible by others. Revised reprint; signed by Rocky.

Fort Robinson [1981/2003] - #4 in the Frontier Series – Hardback \$45-
Signed by Rocky. The story of the Robinson Clan; the family that built and defended their wilderness stockade against the hostile Shawnee and Delaware warriors that sought to overwhelm and drive the settlers from the Endless Hills of the Allegheny Mountains. *Same as above, without dust jacket* \$40-

Song of Blue Moccasin [1989/2004] - #5 in the Frontier Series – Hardback \$45-
Signed by Rocky. The story of Blue Moccasin, honored message bearer of the Delaware and Quehana, killer of Shawnee, and his journey to the heartland of the Iroquois Nations to speak at council, dissuade, influence and plead; to demand peace and neutrality – and to fight when necessary.

***The Hunter's Alaska** [2005] – Hardback \$50-
For those hoping to, or dreaming of, hunting the "Great Land"; how it's done and how it feels – right from the mouth of a true Alaskan hunter. THE definitive work on Alaskan hunting.

OOG – Printed on glossy, waterproof, *childproof* pages; spiral bound, full color, 9" x 12" \$45-
A child's book, written and illustrated by "Uncle Rocky" Chandler; pages numbered with funny illustrated Roman numerals. It chronicles the story of OOG, an infamous foot soldier with extraordinarily large feet and always late to battle. He eventually solves his problem, saves the King's outpost from starvation and is declared a Hero. Sure to be your family's next superhero.
